Sunrise Prominent at U Sports Men's Volleyball Championship

This event marked a significant milestone for Brandon University Athletics, not only hosting the U Sports Men's Volleyball Championship for the first time but also capturing their first-ever U Sports Volleyball title and claiming the Tantramar Trophy. Sunrise Attends Manitoba Ag Days

Sunrise Credit Union was at Manitoba Ag Days from January 21-23, 2025, co-hosting a trade show booth with Sunrise Wealth on the West Main Concourse of the main arena at the Keystone Centre.



Staff engaged with attendees on various topics, including loan rates and programs that can help their agricultural operations. A draw for a Child's Sunrise-branded pedal tractor was conducted at Manitoba Ag Days, with Alvin Gamey of Strathclair winning the prize.

Over 37,000 people attended the 48th edition of Ag Days, which focused on innovation, education, and collaboration. This year's attendance solidified the event as Canada's largest indoor farm show.

Minnedosa Hosts Agriculture Seminar

Underlining their commitment to community education, Sunrise Credit Union's Minnedosa branch hosted an Agriculture Seminar on March 19, 2025, at the Sunrise Credit Union Centre.

Participants heard from industry experts on equipment leasing, tax planning, succession planning, investments, and the Canadian Agricultural Loans Act program. They also had a question-and-answer session at the end of the day.

Sunrise Credit Union and CurlManitoba continued their valuable sponsorship agreement this year, bringing live streaming of three of the most prominent curling events in the province, adding significant value to the curling community.

Fraud Prevention Month

Sunrise Credit Union recognized Fraud Prevention Month in March by encouraging members and the general public to educate themselves on the red flags and tips to avoid being scammed.

Scams highlighted included:

- The Cryptocurrency Scam aims to exploit people by building fake investments in which the victim transfers funds into the fraudster's pocket rather than a legitimate investment portfolio.
- The Grandparent Scam attempts to exploit senior citizens. A fraudster will call a grandparent and impersonate a family member of theirs, typically a grandchild, who needs help.
- The CRA scam aims to exploit people by convincing them they are in trouble with the CRA and need to act quickly before it becomes a legal matter. The fraudster will pretend to be a legitimate government employee.
- The Romance Scam commonly attempts to exploit individuals by developing a relationship, often through social media, with a person and then requesting money to help them with a need.
- Stay in Control of Your Computer Scammers - use remote access applications to gain access to victims' sensitive information.

Staff Rock Socks for World Down Syndrome Day

On March 21, Sunrise Credit Union staff in Cypress River, Holland, and Treherne supported World Down Syndrome Day by wearing mismatched socks.



The date was chosen in recognition that Down Syndrome is a condition in which a person has three copies of Chromosome 21. Mismatched socks, a symbol of diversity and uniqueness, are worn in support to echo how chromosomes appear under a microscope.
